TENDER OPPORTUNITY

BRASS CANAL REMEDIATION PROJECT (NipeX Ref.0000102)

1. INTRODUCTION

Nigerian Agip Oil Company Limited (NAOC), hereby invites reputable Contractors to apply to be considered for inclusion in the bid list for the proposed contract for the BRASS CANAL REMEDIATION PROJECT.

The work location, for ease of project administration, having due regard to climatic, hydrological and local area peculiarities shall be primarily in NAOC operational terminal in Brass in Brass Local Government Area of Bayelsa State being the NAOC Swamp Area (Niger Delta basin).

2. SCOPE OF WORK

This shall include but not limited to:

1. Mobilization, Set up of engineering office and Campsite set up.
2. Mobilization of functional materials, equipment and qualified personnel to site
3. Review and endorse the tender documents for implementation in the performance of the Works
4. Design, construction and installation of new Catch Basin taking cognizance of the fact that the new facilities have to operate with the existing facilities and shall be designed accordingly. Such new facilities, when tied into the existing facilities shall meet current standards and specifications and shall be safe, operable, reliable, efficient and maintainable
5. Supply and Installation of 3no Water Discharge Pumps
6. Supply and Installation of a 2no oil recovery pump
7. Piping and instrument tie-ins
8. Extension of firefighting system.
9. Produced Water from the API skimmers and Oily water from the existing floating roof drain lines shall be re-routed to the catchment basin to be constructed on this project.
10. Construction reinforced concrete retaining walls and a new drainage system. This drainage system shall compose of concrete channels running above and below grade.
11. Perform all HSE activities such as engineering activities, procedures, authorization activities, health, waste management, incident reporting, emergency planning, QRA, HAZID, HAZOP etc.
12. Bush clearing and the removal of top soil
13. Site restoration
14. Demobilization
15. Submission of As built and alignment drawing (3 hard copies)

3. MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS

- a) To be eligible for this tender exercise, interested Contractors are required to be pre-qualified in the **1.17.01 Waste Water Disposal/Recovery Equipment Category & 3.15.07 Waste Management Services** of NipeX Joint Qualification System (NJQS) database. **All successfully pre-qualified suppliers in this category will receive Invitation to Technical Tender (ITT).**

- d) To initiate the JQS pre-qualification process, access www.nipex-ng.com click on services tab followed by NJQS registration.
- e) To be eligible, all tenders must comply with the Nigerian Content requirements in the NipeX system.

4. NIGERIAN CONTENT

Bidders are invited to express complete understanding, willingness and commitment to develop in-country capability and capacity for related items in compliance with the Nigerian Oil and Gas Industry Content Development Act (NOGICD Act, 2010).

Pursuant to the above, bidders' submissions shall be evaluated strictly with the minimum evaluation criteria defined in the NOGICD Act provisions and Schedule. Only bidders whose submissions are in compliance shall proceed to the next stage of the tendering process

The following are some information/documentation that will be required for submission at the ITT stage:

1. Demonstrate that the entity is a Nigerian Registered Company, or Nigerian Registered Company as the contracting entity in genuine alliance or joint venture with foreign company with details on scope and responsibilities of parties for this work. Such companies must show evidence of joint venture binding memorandum of agreement (MOA) duly signed by the CEO of both companies including the following:
Be governed by the laws of the Federal Republic of Nigeria
The scope of work and responsibilities each party will perform in executing the job
The lead bidder evidence or plans of physical operational presence and set-up in Nigeria
2. International or multinational company working through a Nigerian subsidiary must demonstrate that a minimum 50% of equipment to be deployed for execution of work shall be owned by the Nigerian subsidiary by providing a list of equipment for this tender and indicating those that will be owned by the Nigerian subsidiary
3. Tenderer to provide verifiable evidence of ownership and name of the nominated contractor and the MOA should be governed by the laws of the Federal Republic of Nigeria to execute scope of work.
4. Details of Company ownership and shareholding structure with certified true copies of CAC forms CO2 and CO7, including company memorandum & article of association and other evidence of entity's incorporation;
5. provide detailed description (address and layout drawings) of where procurement center and warehouse in Nigeria will be
6. Nigerian Content Plan with detailed description of the role, work scope, man-hours and responsibilities of all Nigerian companies and personnel that are involved in executing the service; that addresses utilization of Nigerian labour, services, materials and equipment for this service, aimed at achieving the minimum Nigerian Content requirements for this category in line with targets set in the schedule to the NOGICD ACT 2010;
7. Current and in-place organization structure with detailed experience and skills of key management personnel with names;
8. Evidence (personnel list and positions with organization chart to substantiate) of percentage of management that are Nigerian nationals and the percentage of the total workforce that are Nigerians;
9. Detailed training plan for the service which must be related to the service to be carried upon identification of Capacity Gaps
10. Detailed description of the location of in-country committed facilities & infrastructure (assets, equipment, storage facilities etc) in Nigeria to support this contract or submit a credible and verifiable plan towards setting-up;
11. Details of the applicant's relationship with local suppliers and service providers (e.g. in the management of the logistic, personnel);
12. Evidence of Nigerian Content Equipment Certificate (NCEC) or evidence of application to NCDMB for the issuance of the Nigerian Content Equipment Certificate;
13. State any further innovative proposals that would enhance the development of Nigerian Content for the Project.

NOTE: Only Nigerian Companies are qualified for this service.

- Bidders shall be requested to provide evidence to show their compliance with the above listed requirements at the ITT stage.
- Failure to meet the Nigerian Content requirements is a "FATAL FLAW."

5. CLOSING DATE

Only tenderers who are pre-qualified with NJQS product/service category, **1.17.01 – Waste Water Disposal/Recovery Equipment Category & 3.15.07 Waste Management Services** as at 15th february 2018, being the advert closing date, shall be invited to submit Technical Bids.
