INTRODUCTION

Star Deep Water Petroleum Limited (SDWPL) invites interested and prequalified companies for this tender opportunity for the Provision of Safe Welding Habitat Services. The services are estimated to commence first quarter of 2020 for two (2) years with an optional 1-year extension.

This scope covers all items required for the supply and installation of flexible, positive pressurized safe welding habitats and mobile gas detection/shutdown equipment.

The Safe Welding Habitat activities shall be supplied and installed, for Welders' use, in a simultaneous operations mode on operating (live) facilities. Therefore, all powered equipment associated with the habitat shall be certified for the area in which it will be operating.

SCOPE OF WORK/SERVICE REQUIREMENTS

Offshore Scope

The offshore scope shall include installing and maintaining the safe welding pressurized habitat to create a safe enclosure when there is a requirement for hot work in potentially hazardous areas, in and around any of the offshore topside modules which have been divided into the following main categories:

- Accommodation superstructure
- Helideck
- Main deck area & Poop deck areas
- Module 1P Port lay-down area
- Module 2P- Power generation
- Module 3P Sea water injection
- Module 4P Oil inlet module
- Module 5P Oil production train No1
- Module 6P Oil production train No2
- Module 1S Lay down module
- Module 2S Power generation No1
- Module 3S Future module
- Module 4S Gas Compression No1
- Module 5S Gas Compression No2
- Module 6S Gas compression No3
- Module 7P Flare

The use of the safe welding habitat shall cause minimum disruption to FPSO process facilities and operations. It shall be used to provide a safe enclosure for welders to carry out repair or replacement of process pipe work and equipment, removal and replacement of hand rails, removal and replacement of deck plate and walkways, vessel internal and external nozzle repairs, crane boom structural repairs and refurbishment, housing Non IS equipment, riser and caisson installation, and applying specialist coatings or removing insulation which requires temperature controlled enclosures, and as required in other applications.

Onshore Scope

• Where required by company, the onshore scope of work shall include project management, planning, storage, load out and sea fastening of safe welding habitat equipment, materials, miscellaneous tools and consumables to support the Agbami FPSO and other Company facilities and assets.

NIGERIAN CONTENT

SDWPL is committed to the development of the Nigerian Oil and Gas business in observance with the Nigerian Oil and Gas Industry Content Development Act 2010 (NOGICD Act) enacted by the Federal Government of Nigeria in April 2010.

Such companies must show evidence of joint venture binding agreement duly signed by the CEO of both companies including evidence or plans of physical operational presence and set-up in Nigeria
- B. Furnish details of company ownership and share holding structure. Also submit clear photocopies of your CAC Forms CO2 and Co7
- C. Provide evidence of the percentage of 1) key management positions that are held by Nigerians and 2) total work force that are Nigerians. Also, show overall percentage of work to be performed by Nigerian resources relative to total work volume.
- D. Provide a Nigerian Content Plan with a detailed description of the role, work scope, man-hours and responsibilities of all Nigerian companies and personnel that will be involved in executing the work. Also provide details of Nigerian Content contact or manager.
- E. State proposed total scope of work to be performed by Nigerian personnel (whether contracted directly or under subcontract agreements) with names and addresses including evidences of well equipped offices and workshop; attach experience of such patronage.
- F. Provide evidence of domiciliation of project management and procurement centers in Nigeria with physical addresses (not P.O. Box).
- G. Location of in-country facilities, (Equipment, storage, workshops, repair & maintenance facilities and, testing facilities).
- H. Bidder must be willing and able to provide evidence of maximization of made in Nigeria goods
- I. Provide details on any other Nigerian Content initiative your company is involved in.
- J. Provide evidence of MOU with OGTAN registered trainer to conduct classroom module of training and on the job attachment
- K. Provide human capacity building development plan including budget which must be minimum 10% of project man-hours or cost. Training will be targeted at developing capacity other than bidder's personnel. Trainees will be nominated from a database maintained by NCDMB and the services of OGTAN registered trainers utilized to cover classroom modules.
- L. Provide details of equipment ownership or fully executed contracts for long term lease of
- M.Bidders (Vendors, Original Equipment, Manufacturers-OEMs, and EPC Contractors) are required to present Nigerian Content Equipment Certificate (NCEC) issued by Nigerian Content Development and Monitoring Board (or evidence of application for the certificate) in respect of any components, spares, equipments, systems and packages to be used in the proposed project under tender.
- N. All Bidders for a project/contract/service with a completion period of 12 months or more are required to submit as part of the Nigerian Content requirement, a signed Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between it and one of the research and development (R&D) Clusters established by the NCDMB. The MOA shall be relevant to the project and shall indicate how the Bidder intends to use the relevant R&D Clusters during project execution.
