1. INTRODUCTION

Mobil Producing Nigeria Unlimited (MPN), operator of NNPC/MPN Joint Venture plans to engage the services of competent and qualified firms to provide Material/Equipment Preservation at its in-country Warehouses and other storage locations for an anticipated contract term of Two (2) years with a one (1) year optional renewal period.

2. SCOPE OF WORK

The scope of work includes, but is not limited to the Provision of Material/Equipment Preservation Services.

Interested companies must be able to provide qualified services (Personnel, Materials and Equipment) to carry out the following Materials/Equipment Preservation:

- A. Preventive Preservation: This is used to prevent corrosion, rust build up, and surface deterioration on materials having high tendency to rust in a short time frame. Surface coating, wrapping or environmental control is used as a means of retaining material integrity.
- B. Chemical Preservation: MPN-provided preservation chemicals (or suitable alternatives recommended by materials manufacturers) are used for preservation on selected metal surfaces/equipment internals to prevent rust. Chemical application could be used as part of the preventive and/or remediation processes.
- C. Remediation: This is used on already corroded materials requiring recovery of fine metal surface. Further actions are taken after the recovery exercise to prevent further corrosion by coating, wrapping or measures to control the environment that prevent further damage.

3. MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS

- A. To be eligible for this tender exercise, interested contractors are required to be prequalified in all or any of the three listed categories - 3.01.13: (Materials technology/Anti Corrosion/Surface Protection Services), 3.05.06: (Surface treatment, Sandblasting, Painting, Coating, & Fireproofing Services) and 3.05.19 (Preservation of Mechanical & Electrical Component Services) in NipeX Joint Qualification Scheme (NJQS) database. All successfully prequalified suppliers in each relevant category will receive Invitation to Technical Tender (ITT)
- B. To view the product/service category you are listed for and determine if you are eligible: Open www.nipex-ng.com and access NJQS with your log-in details, click on continue Joint Qualification Scheme tool, click check my supplier status and then click supplier product group.
- C. If you are not listed in any of the three product/service categories, and you are registered with DPR to do this type of business, contact NipeX office at 30 Oyinkan Abayomi Street, Ikoyi, Lagos, with your DPR certificate as evidence for verification and necessary update.

4. NIGERIAN CONTENT

Company is committed to the development of the Nigerian Oil and Gas business in compliance with the Nigerian Oil and Gas Industry Content Development Act 2010

"Nigerian company" is a company registered in Nigeria in accordance with the provisions of Companies and Allied Matters Act with not less than 51% equity shares by Nigerians.

Tenderers shall consider Nigerian content as an important element of their overall project development and management philosophy for project execution.

As part of their submissions, Tenderers shall:

- A. Provide a description of its committed infrastructure (asset, equipment, technical and administrative office(s), inspection tools, etc.) in Nigeria to support this contract and evidence that a minimum of 50% of all equipment/tools deployed to work by multinational and international companies are owned by the Nigerian subsidiary.
- B. Demonstrate that its entity is a Nigerian registered company, defined as a company registered in Nigeria in accordance with the provision of Company and Allied Matters Act. Provide details of its Ownership Structure. Submit certified true copies of CAC form (C02 and CO7) including Memorandum and Article of Association. For Nigerian company in alliance with a foreign company or multinational, submit evidence of binding agreement of the alliance duly signed by the CEOs of both parties.
- C. Submit a plan on how it intends to give first consideration to goods and services provided from within Nigeria, to meet 75% Spend NC target in line with the requirements of the NCD Act.
- D. Demonstrate key Management positions that are Nigerian Nationals and the percentage of the Company total workforce (direct and in-direct employees) that are Nigerians
- E. Submit a plan on how it intends to provide Human Capacity Development and Personnel Training

Tenderer's failure to comply with the NOGICD Act or demonstrate commitment to Nigerian Content development will result in Tenderer's disqualification.
