#### 1.0 INTRODUCTION:

To support the NNPC/SEPLAT JV's production plans, there is need to carry out access and location preparation within Seplat Eastern Asset (OML-53) in readiness for drilling operations. The access and location preparation call-off contract is required to optimize the time and resources that would be spent in one-off tendering for such services. The access and location preparation call-off contract shall be used for the preparation of well site locations for drilling activities and related major civil engineering construction works required within SEPLAT eastern operational areas. Qualified contractors shall need to demonstrate capability in major civil construction works including earthworks, location preparation, road construction and foundation works within the Niger Delta region of Nigeria. The proposed strategy will utilize the NipeX contracting platform to run the tendering process.

#### 2.0 SERVICES REQUIRED/SCOPE OF WORK:

As a minimum requirement, the selected contractors shall have the necessary experience, equipment/resources, capability and shall be fully responsible for the provision of services as detailed in the table below in the onshore operations.

The selected contractors must have proven experience in major civil works including access and location preparation in terrains in the Niger Delta region. The experience can be demonstrated by showing examples of successful delivery of similar works, proof of equipment ownership or valid MOU for lease, competent manpower with relevant qualifications/experience and financial capability to seamlessly deliver projects of such magnitude without depending on outstanding invoice payments on previous jobs completed.

## 3.0 MANDATORY TENDER REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. To be eligible for this tender exercise, interested companies are required to be pre-qualified in the relevant NipeX Joint Qualification System (NJQS) database Product/Services categories indicated in 2.0 above. All successfully prequalified contractors in this category will receive an Invitation To Tender (ITT).

- 3. If you are not listed in a Product/Service category and you are registered with Department of Petroleum Resources (DPR) to do business, contact NipeX Office at 8, Bayo Kuku Street, Ikoyi, Lagos with your DPR certificate as evidence for verification and necessary update.

- 5. Any entity intending to bid as a joint venture/alliance must demonstrate a genuine alliance or joint venture with details on scope and responsibilities of parties for this work, and payment arrangements. Such companies must show evidence of joint venture via a legally binding agreement duly signed by the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of both companies. In the absence of a binding legal agreement relating directly to this activity, the company submitting the response on behalf of the alliance/joint venture must supply a power of attorney authorizing it to do so.
- 6. To be eligible, all tenders must comply with the Nigerian Content requirements in the NipeX system. In the section below: OGTAN shall mean Oil and Gas Trainers Association of Nigeria and NCEC shall mean Nigerian Content Equipment Certificate

#### 4.0 NIGERIAN CONTENT DEVELOPMENT:

SEPLAT, as an indigenous exploration and production (energy) company in Nigeria is committed to the development of the capabilities of Nigerian companies in compliance with the provisions of the Nigerian Oil and Gas Industry Content Development (NOGICD) Act 2010 for Nigerian Content Development. Tenderers are to note that they will be requested in the technical tender to provide details of their relevant strategy to ensure that they fully comply with the Nigerian Oil & Gas Industry Content Act, 2010 as provided at http://www.ncdmb.gov.ng/images/GUIDELINES/NCACT.pdf, in view of the fact that non-compliance will constitute a fatal flaw in all contract evaluations. In the light of the above, tenderers shall be expected by the Nigerian Content Development Monitoring Board (NCDMB) to:

- 1. Provide evidence of company Ownership Structure form CO2 and CO7, registration on NOGIC JQS and DPR certificate.
- 2. Provide a Nigerian Content Plan which shall explain the methodology of how it intends to comply with the requirements of the NOGICD Act and how to achieve the set target(s) in the Schedule of the NOGICD Act and any targets set by The Board.
- 3. Provide a project-specific organogram showing Names and Nationalities of all key personnel not limited to just key personnel that will execute the work scope for this service.
- 4. Provide evidence of a valid Nigerian Content Equipment Certificate (NCEC) issued by NCDMB in respect of equipment to be deployed in the execution of the work scope either new 2021 NCEC Category "EC" valid Category "C" under previous NCEC guidelines.
- 5. In line with the NCD Human Capacity Development Initiative, Bidder shall commit to providing Project-Specific training, man-hour, budget, skill development and understudy plan for Nigerian personnel utilizing OGTAN registered trainer(s) or other approved NCDMB training institution(s).
- 6. Provide a plan of how it intends to give first consideration to materials manufactured in Nigeria as well as assembled goods of Nigerian origin which shall include a breakdown of all materials and consumables to be utilized and identifying those that are found locally, finished products and materials that will be procured from Nigerian manufacturing and assembly plants, finished goods that order can be placed from outside Nigeria through Nigerian authorized vendors and accredited agents and those that would be directly imported.
- 7. Tenderer shall provide detailed description of the location of in-country committed facilities not limited to administrative office, technical office equipment, storage, workshops, repair and maintenance facilities for execution of the work scope.
- 8. Details of in-country procurement plan and Binding MOA to source goods and materials with names and addresses of the Nigerian suppliers.
- 9. Tenderer shall in line with NCDMB Community Content Guideline develop a Community Content Plan for review and approval by the Board.
