



## TENDER OPPORTUNITY FOR PROVISION OF PLATFORM SUPPLY VESSEL SERVICES ON OML 130

#### 1. Introduction

Total Upstream Nigeria Limited (TUPNI) operator of the OML 130 invites interested and reputable indigenous suppliers with suitable vessels, personnel, equipment and relevant experience for consideration for inclusion in the tenderer's list for subject tender opportunity.

#### 2. Brief description of Work Scope and Specifications

Scope of SERVICES include the provision of Platform Supply Vessel (PSV) Services within OML 130 PERMIT AREA including AKPO, EGINA and PREOWEI fields for a duration of three (3) firm years plus two (2) optional yearly extension (3yrs +1yr+1yr). Specifically, two (2) large (>5000dwt) or three (3) medium (>3000dwt) PSVs, which shall:

- ✓ Supply essential items including cargo, drilling supplies, fuel oil and food
- ✓ Perform safety stand-by and security duties at rig, FPSO and offloading buoy locations and during helicopter take-off and landing
- ✓ Provide passenger accommodation/transportation
- ✓ Perform oil spill clearance & firefighting operations (Vessel shall be classified FIFI 1)
- ✓ Perform search and rescue operations.
- ✓ Perform mooring for barges offshore for heading control (no dynamic towing)
- ✓ Perform Dynamic Positioning operations (DP Class 2), 24 Hours per day and 7 days per week
- ✓ Be manned by competent crews with valid STWC certificate, etc.
- ✓ Be supported by experienced onshore technical management and support organization with proven track record with TUPNI and/or other IOCs for provision of similar or same services.
- ✓ Meet the Class requirements as per IACS

#### Mandatory Requirement – Tenderer

- ✓ Tenderer must as per the latest monthly Vendor Categorization Report published by NCDMB under the Marine Vessel Utilization Scheme Report, have an "AAA" or "AA" class status under Service Company Categorization and ownership of a Platform Supply Vessel under "Category 2"
- ✓ Where Tenderer owned vessel is not proposed, verifiable and valid long term MOU (Memorandum of Understanding) with the proposed vessel owner and with the operating company if applicable, must be provided.

#### Mandatory Requirement – Vessel

- ✓ Vessel's age should not be more than 10 years (during the tenure of the firm period) from the manufactured year i.e. not older than 2009
- ✓ Vessel shall be DP Class 2 and classified FIFI 1

#### 3. Mandatory Requirements

- ✓ To be eligible for this tender exercise, interested suppliers are required to be pre-qualified in the Tugs / ROV Support / Diving Support Vessel (3.08.01) category of the NipeX Joint Qualification Scheme (NJQS) database. Only successful pre-qualified suppliers in this category, will receive an invitation to submit their tenders for this service.
- ✓ To determine if you are pre-qualified and view the product/services category you are listed for: Open <http://vendors.nipexjqs.com> and access NJQS with your log in details. Click on Products/Services Status tab to view your status and product codes.
- ✓ If you are not listed in the product/service category but you have registered with the Department of Petroleum Resources (DPR) to do business, contact the NipeX office at 8 Bayo Kuku Road, Ikoyi Lagos with your DPR certificate as evidence for verification and necessary update.
- ✓ To initiate the NJQS pre-qualification process, access [www.nipex-ng.com](http://www.nipex-ng.com) click on "Services" tab followed by "NJQS Registration".
- ✓ To be eligible, all tenders must comply with the Nigerian content requirements in the NipeX system.

#### 4. Nigerian Content Requirements

TUPNI is committed to the development of the Nigerian Oil and gas business in compliance with the Nigerian Content Act 2010 for Nigerian Content Development.

As from the commencement of this Act, the minimum Nigerian Content in any project, service or product specification to be executed in the Nigerian oil and gas industry shall be consistent with the level set in the Schedule of the Act and any other targets as may be directed by the Nigerian Content Development and Monitoring Board (The Board)

Tenderer(s) shall comply with all the provisions of the Nigerian Content Act that relate to this advert and in particular comply with the minimum Nigerian Content percentage for the scopes which are covered in the Schedule of the Act. This also includes and any other requirement that may arise from time to time not explicitly stated in this advert but which apply to the services in fulfillment of the Nigerian Content Act, in the submission of their Tender.

Failure to fully comply with the Nigerian Content Act or demonstrate commitment to Nigerian Content Development Policy of the Nigerian government shall result in the disqualification of the tenderer from the bidding process.

As part of their technical tender submissions, Tenderer shall:

- a.) Develop a Nigerian Content Execution Plan (NCP), which shall explain the methodology of how it intends to comply with the requirements of the Act and how to achieve the set target(s) in the Schedule of Nigerian Oil & Gas Industry Content Development Act and any targets set by The Board. Tenderer shall be category A/AA vendor and own the nominated vessel (PSV) which shall be categorized Nigerian owned in the NCDMB NOGIC JQS marine vessel categorization report, or a category A/AA providing a binding MOA with another category A/AA vendor owning the nominated Nigerian vessel, so far the category A/AA vessel owner is not bidding on the tender.
- b.) Develop a Technology Transfer Plan which shall explain the methodology of how it intends to promote the effective transfer of technologies from alliance partners to Nigerian individuals and companies.
- c.) Develop an employment and training plan which shall explain how first considerations shall be given to employment and training of Nigerians in work program on the contract, hiring and training needs with a breakdown of the skills needed and anticipated skill shortage in the Nigerian labour force including the training and understudy program for succession planning.
- d.) Submit a plan for how you intend to give first consideration to services provided from within Nigeria with a list of work packages, 3rd party services and subcontracts that should be reserved for Nigerian indigenous contractors and those for Community Contractors including the list of services that will be provided by companies of Nigerian origin.
- e.) Demonstrate that entity is a Nigerian indigenous company or an indigenous company in genuine alliance with a foreign-owned or multinational company registered in Nigeria. Submit certified true copies of CAC forms 10, 02 & 07 (or its equivalent; CAC 2.3, 2.4, 2.5, etc.) including company memorandum & article of association and/or evidence of entity's incorporation, shareholding & ownership structure in Nigeria. Where applicable, evidence of the Partnership/JV Agreement (where applicable) between Indigenous Company and their alliances with duly signed exclusive binding Memorandum of Agreement by the CEO of the entities in the alliance.
- f.) Provide detailed description of the location of in-country committed facilities & infrastructure (technical / maintenance office, and administrative space) in Nigeria to support this contract.
- g.) Provide a project-specific training, man-hour budget, skill development and technology transfer plan for Nigerian personnel or indigenous business to acquire competence and/or certification on the project.
- h.) Provide evidence (personnel list and positions with organization chart to substantiate) of percentage of management that are Nigerian Nationals and the percentage of the total workforce that are Nigerians.
- i.) All bidders tendering shall demonstrate how the NC target of 90% spend Accommodation Platform/vessels as stated in the NOGICD Act 2010 would be achieved.

**NOTE:** Failure to comply with the provision of the Nigerian Content Act 2010 or to demonstrate commitment to the development of the Nigerian Content Policy shall result in the disqualification of the tenderer from the bidding process.

#### 5. Additional Information

- a.) Only Nigerian indigenous service companies having verifiable Nigerian equity shareholding of 51% and above shall submit bids for this tender.
- b.) Failure to provide any of the listed documents or information may automatically disqualify the tenderer.
- c.) All costs incurred in registering and prequalifying for this and other service categories in NJQS shall be borne solely by the suppliers.
- d.) This advertisement shall neither be construed as any form of commitment on the part of TUPNI to award any contract to any company and/or associated companies, sub-contractors or agents, nor shall it entitle pre-qualified companies to make any claims whatsoever, and/or seek any indemnity from TUPNI and/or any of its partners by virtue of such companies having been pre-qualified in NJQS.
- e.) The ITT and any further progression of this tender shall be via NipeX portal. Interested suppliers are therefore advised to ensure that their profiles in NipeX are active with a valid official email address accessible by their organization as this shall be the only means to transmit the ITT.
- f.) Man hour figures for Capital Project Portfolios are estimates to provide definition to the scope and do not constitute guaranteed quantities.
- g.) TUPNI will only recognize and correspond with duly authorized officers of the pre-qualified tenderers and NOT through individuals or agents acting on their behalf.

#### 6. Closing Date

Only suppliers, who are pre-qualified and have a "LIVE" status on NJQS category **Tugs / ROV Support / Diving Support Vessel (3.08.01)** as at **Monday, 30 September, 2019**, being the tender advert closing date, shall be invited to submit technical and commercial tenders.
