



## TENDER OPPORTUNITY FOR PROVISION OF TUG VESSEL AND BARGE SERVICES ON OML 130 NipeX TENDER REF.: 100003685

### 1. Introduction

Total Upstream Nigeria Limited (TUPNI) operator of the OML 130 invites interested and reputable indigenous suppliers with suitable vessels, personnel, equipment and relevant experience for consideration for inclusion in the tenderer's list for subject tender opportunity.

### 2. Brief description of Work Scope and Specifications

Scope of SERVICES includes the provision of Tug Vessel and Cargo Barge (on ad-hoc basis) services within OML 130 PERMIT AREA including AKPO, EGINA and PREOWEI fields for a duration of two (2) firm years plus one (1) year Optional duration (2+1).

The duties of the provided one (1) Tug **90mt minimum bollard pull**, DP Class I, **maximum 100MT bollard pull** (push/pull bow) and one (1) Tug (AHTS) **minimum 100mt bollard pull, maximum 110 bollard pull**, DP Class II w/mud and fluid capacities, with minimum 12 beds for Company personnel and ROV set up possibility shall include but not limited to;

- ✓ Towing Services
- ✓ Safety and Close Stand-by and Security duties at rig, FPSO and Buoy locations
- ✓ Firefighting (VESSEL shall be classified FIFI 1)
- ✓ Oil Spill Clearance
- ✓ Search and Rescue.
- ✓ Tandem and SBM offloading assistance to tankers
- ✓ Tandem and SBM hose management and maintenance

The duties of the Provided one (1) cargo barge on ad hoc basis for transportation of production/water injection jumpers' shall include but not limited to the following specifications:-

- ✓ Length over all around 85m to 95m.
- ✓ Breadth around 29m-35m
- ✓ Gangway length around 4m -7m
- ✓ Deadweight around 8000mt to 9000mt
- ✓ Deck and side plating around 15mm -16mm
- ✓ Deck strength, minimum 10mt/sqm
- ✓ Draft around 4.0m -5.5m
- ✓ Fitted with a boat landing platform to facilitate safe transfer of personnel via FCB ( Boat landing shall be constructed and installed as per Company specifications; GS EP STR 901)
- ✓ Meet the Classification requirements as per IACS

### Mandatory Requirement – TENDERER

- ✓ TENDERER must as per the latest monthly Vendor Categorization Report published by NCDMB under the Marine Vessel Utilization Scheme Report, have an "AAA" or "AA" class status under Service Company Categorization and ownership of Tug vessels and Cargo Barges (on ad-hoc basis) under "Category 2".
- ✓ TENDERER shall demonstrate evidence of Nigerian ownership of the Marine vessels (Tug Vessel and Cargo Barge), duly categorized as A/AA on the NCDMB NOGIC JQS marine vessel categorization or category A/AA vendor providing MOA with another category A/AA vendor (not bidding for this tender) on the NCDMB NOGIC marine vessel categorization owing the nominated vessel (Tug Vessel and Cargo Barge)
- ✓ **Mandatory Requirement – Vessel**
- ✓ Age of the vessel: should not be more than 10 years (during the tenure of the firm period) from the manufactured year i.e. not older than 2009

**Note:** ROV Set-up possibilities for AHTS shall be an added advantage.

### Mandatory Requirement – Cargo Barge

Age of the cargo barge shall not be more than 20 years (during the tenure of the firm period) from the manufactured year i.e. not older than 1999.

### 3. Mandatory Requirements

- To be eligible for this tender exercise, interested suppliers are required to be pre-qualified in the **Tugs / ROV Support / Diving Support Vessel (3.08.01)** category of the **NipeX Joint Qualification Scheme (NJQS)** database. Only successful pre-qualified suppliers in this category, will receive an invitation to submit their tenders for this service.
- To determine if you are pre-qualified and view the product/services category you are listed for: Open <http://vendors.nipex-ng.com> and access NJQS with your log in details. Click on Products/Services Status tab to view your status and product codes.
- If you are not listed in the product/service category but you have registered with the Department of Petroleum Resources (DPR) to do business in the Nigerian Oil & Gas Industry, contact the NipeX administration office at 8 Bayo Kuku Street, Ikoyi Lagos with your DPR certificate as evidence for verification and necessary update.
- To initiate the NJQS pre-qualification process, access [www.nipex-ng.com](http://www.nipex-ng.com) click on click on "Service" tab followed by "NJQS Registration".
- To be eligible, all tenders must comply with the Nigerian content requirements in the NipeX system.

a) Develop a Nigerian Content Execution Plan, which shall explain the methodology of how it intends to comply with the requirements of the Act and how to achieve the set target(s) in the Schedule of Nigerian Oil & Gas Industry Content Development Act and any targets set by The Board.

b.) Develop a Technology Transfer Plan which shall explain the methodology of how it intends to promote the effective transfer of technologies from alliance partners to Nigerian individuals and companies.

c.) Develop an employment and training plan which shall explain how first considerations shall be given to employment and training of Nigerians in work program on the contract, hiring and training needs with a breakdown of the skills needed and anticipated skill shortage in the Nigerian labour force including the training and understudy program for succession planning.

d.) Submit a plan for how you intend to give first consideration to services provided from within Nigeria with a list of work packages, 3rd party services and subcontracts that should be reserved for Nigerian indigenous contractors and those for Community Contractors including the list of services that will be provided by companies of Nigerian origin.

e.) Demonstrate that entity is a Nigerian indigenous company or an indigenous company in genuine alliance with a foreign-owned or multinational company registered in Nigeria. Submit certified true copies of CAC forms 10, 02 & 07 (or its equivalent; CAC 2.3, 2.4, 2.5, etc.) including company memorandum & article of association and/or evidence of entity's incorporation, shareholding & ownership structure in Nigeria. Where applicable, evidence of the Partnership/JV Agreement (where applicable) between Indigenous Company and their alliances with duly signed exclusive binding Memorandum of Agreement by the CEO of the entities in the alliance.

f.) Provide detailed description of the location of in-country committed facilities & infrastructure (technical / maintenance office, and administrative space) in Nigeria to support this contract.

g.) Provide a project-specific training, man-hour budget, skill development and technology transfer plan for Nigerian personnel or indigenous business to acquire competence and/or certification on the project.

h.) Provide evidence (personnel list and positions with organization chart to substitute) of percentage of management that are Nigerian Nationals and the percentage of the total workforce that are Nigerians.

I.) All bidders tendering shall demonstrate how the NC target of 90% spend for Tugs and support diving vessels as stated in the NOGICD Act 2010 would be achieved.

J.) Tenderer shall be category A/AA vendor and own the nominated vessel (Tug Vessel (AHTS) and Cargo Barge) which shall be categorized Nigerian owned in the NCDMB NOGIC JQS marine vessel categorization report, or a category A/AA providing a binding MOA for with another category A/AA vendor owning the nominated Nigerian vessel, thus far the category A/AA vessel owner is not bidding on the tender.

**NOTE:** Failure to comply with the provision of the Nigerian Content Act 2010 or to demonstrate commitment to the development of the Nigerian Content Policy shall result in the disqualification of the tenderer from the bidding process.

### 5. Additional Information

- a.) Failure to provide any of the listed documents or information may automatically disqualify the tenderer.
- b.) All costs incurred in registering and prequalifying for this and other service categories in NJQS shall be borne solely by the suppliers.
- c.) This advertisement shall neither be construed as any form of commitment on the part of TUPNI to award any contract to any company and/or associated companies, sub-contractors or agents, nor shall it entitle pre-qualified companies to make any claims whatsoever, and/or seek any indemnity from TUPNI and/or any of its partners by virtue of such companies having been pre-qualified in NJQS.
