



TENDER OPPORTUNITY FOR PROVISION OF WELL TESTING SERVICES FOR OML 130

1. Introduction

Total Upstream Nigeria Limited (TUPNI) operator of the OML 130 issues tender opportunity to interested and reputable Contractors with suitable equipment and relevant experience for consideration to tender for the Provision of Well Testing services for its Deep Offshore OML130 operations.

2. Brief description of Work Scope and Specifications

The expected duration of this contract is two (2) years plus two (2) optional duration of one (1) year each.

The successful TENDERER will be required to provide all the works and associated 'Services' for;

- Complete offshore well test package design and installation
- Perform associated well testing studies and SITs
- Perform Well testing operations
- Well testing equipment maintenance and provision of critical spares
- Down hole Testing and Subsea System Equipment
- Injection and well effluent treatment chemicals - Methanol/Mono ethylene glycol services (MeOH / MEG), demulsifiers, defoamers, antiwax, etc
- Provision of real time specialist support and data transmission during well operations
- Operation and procedure performance improvement reviews.
- Final operation reporting including data and post job evaluation

The scope of Services includes the provision of Engineering, Personnel and Contractor equipment required for the continuous operation and maintenance of well testing and MeOH / MEG services and provision of onshore engineering support over the duration of the Contract.

The services shall include well cleanup of all oil producers and possibly some water injectors, and well testing for possible exploration wells within the development period.

The services shall include well testing and if required standard DST which require Down Hole DST tools, down hole gauges, down hole sampling, perforating equipment and Sub Sea equipment. The downhole equipment shall be supplied by the successful TENDERER.

3. Mandatory Requirements

- To be eligible for this tender exercise, interested suppliers are required to be pre-qualified in the **3.04.14 Well Testing Services category** of the **NipeX Joint Qualification System (NJQS)**. **All successfully pre-qualified suppliers in this category will receive an Invitation to Technical Tender (ITT)**.
- To determine if you are pre-qualified and view the product/service category you are listed for; open <http://vendors.nipex-ng.com> and access NJQS with your log-in details. Click on Products/Services Status tab to view your status and product codes.
- If you are not listed in the product/service category but you have registered with the Department of Petroleum Resources (DPR) to do business in the Nigerian Oil & Gas Industry, contact the NipeX administration office at 8 Bayo Kuku Street, Ikoyi Lagos with your DPR certificate as evidence for verification and necessary update.
- To initiate the NJQS pre-qualification process, access www.nipex-ng.com to download the application form, make necessary payments and contact NipeX office for further action.
- To be eligible, all tenders must comply with the Nigerian content requirements in the NipeX system.

4. Nigerian Content

TUPNI is committed to the development of the Nigerian Oil and gas business in compliance with the Nigerian Content Act 2010 for Nigerian Content Development.

As from the commencement of this Act, the minimum Nigerian Content in any project, service or product specification to be executed in the Nigerian oil and gas industry shall be consistent with the level set in the Schedule of the Act and any other targets as may be directed by the Nigerian Content Development and Monitoring Board (The Board)

Tenderer(s) shall comply with all the provisions of the Nigerian Content Act that relate to this advert and in particular comply with the minimum Nigerian Content percentage for the scopes which are covered in the Schedule of the Act. This also includes and any other requirement that may arise from time to time not explicitly stated in this advert but which apply to the services in fulfillment of the Nigerian Content Act, in the submission of their Tender.

Failure to fully comply with the Nigerian Content Act or demonstrate commitment to Nigerian Content Development Policy of the Nigerian government shall result in the disqualification of the tenderer from the bidding process.

As part of their submissions, Tenderer shall:

- a). Demonstrate that the entity is a Nigerian indigenous company having greater than or equal to 51% Nigerian shareholding in the registered company, by providing details of company ownership and shareholding structure (form CO2 and CO7). Also provide evidence of registration on NOGICD JQS.
- b). Tenderer shall provide detailed description of the location of in-country committed facilities & infrastructure (assets, equipment, technical office, and administrative space, storage, workshop, assembly area) in Nigeria to support this contract
- c). Submit Tenderer's corporate organizational and project/contract specific organogram for all key personnel not limited to well Testing Services Manager, Well Testing Services Coordinator, Engineer, Supervisor, CT Operator, etc. CV's of all personnel as listed in the project

organogram should be submitted. For any position to be occupied by expatriate, tenderer shall provide evidence to obtain expatriate quota approval granted by NCDMB before any expatriate is deployed to execute this work scope"

- d). Tenderer shall provide evidence (Purchase receipt, Bill of Landing etc.) of at least 50% Nigerian ownership of the equipment.
- e). Tenderer shall provide evidence of Valid category C NIGERIAN CONTENT EQUIPMENT CERTIFICATE (NCEC) issued by Nigerian Content Development and Monitoring Board in respect of ownership of equipment to be utilized on the project.
- f). In line with the NCD Human Capacity Development Initiative, Bidder shall commit to providing Project-Specific training, man-hour, budget, skill development and understudy plan for Nigerian personnel utilizing OGTAN registered trainer(s) or other approved NCDMB training institution(s).
- g.) Tenderer shall provide evidence of Binding MOA with Nigerian companies or procurement items to executing of the work scope.

All bidders during tendering shall demonstrate how the NC targets of the NOGICD Act would be achieved in accordance with the services.

NOTE: Failure to comply with the provision of the Nigerian Content Act 2010 or to demonstrate commitment to the development of the Nigerian Content Policy shall result in the disqualification of the tenderer from the bidding process.

5. Additional Information

- a.) Failure to provide any of the listed documents or information may automatically disqualify the tenderer.
- b.) All costs incurred in registering and prequalifying for this and other service categories in NJQS shall be borne solely by the Contractors/suppliers.
- c.) This advertisement shall neither be construed as an invitation to Tender (ITT) nor a commitment on the part of TUPNI to award a contract to any supplier and/or associated companies, subcontractors or agents, nor shall it entitle pre-qualified companies to make any claims whatsoever, and/or seek any indemnity from TUPNI and/or any of its partners by virtue of such companies having been pre-qualified in NJQS.
- d.) The ITT and any further progression of this tender shall be via NipeX portal. Interested bidders are therefore advised to ensure that their profiles in NipeX are active with a valid official email address accessible by their organization as this shall be the only means to transmit the ITT.
- e.) Man hour figures for Capital Project Portfolios are estimates to provide definition to the scope and do not constitute guaranteed quantities.
- f.) TUPNI will only recognize and correspond with duly authorized officers of the pre-qualified bidders and NOT through individuals or agents acting on their behalf.
- g.) Interested tenderer(s) should note that TUPNI has very cordial relationship with the host communities of the sites where these services will be performed based on existing Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). Prospective tenderer(s) will be required to implement the obligations of the MOU as part of their contract.

Only suppliers, who are pre-qualified and have a "LIVE" status on NJQS category **Well Testing Services (3.04.14)** as at 24 February 2020, being the tender advert closing date, shall be invited to submit technical tender.
