I.0 INTRODUCTION

FIRST Exploration and Petroleum Development Company Limited, on behalf of NNPC/FIRST E&P Joint Venture, is seeking competent companies to apply for the Provision of Facilities Maintenance services for NNPC/FIRST E&P JV OML 83 & OML 85 Assets.

The Primary duration for this contract is Two Years firm plus One Year option to renew.

2.0 SCOPE OF WORK/SERVICE REQUIREMENT

The scope of services will cover but not be limited to:

providing supplies, services, and personnel for the following: General Maintenance (cleaning, general office repairs, replacement of nuts & bolts), refuse collection, gardening, fumigation and pest control. Provision of personnel (cleaners, tea ladies, site technicians and supervisor).

3.0 BASIC REQUIREMENTS

Any Company seeking to be selected must satisfy the following conditions:

- 1. Be a Limited Liability Company registered in Nigeria
- Certified true copy of the Certificate of Incorporation obtained from Corporate Affairs Commission (CAC), Forms CO2 and CO7.
- 3. Current Nigerian Upsteam Petroleum Regulatory Commission (NUPRC) Permit to operate as an Oil Industry Service Company.
- 4. Have acquired relevant experience in Oil and Gas business.
- 5. Must be in good standing with NNPC and Operators.
- Must be a good corporate citizen of Nigeria that pays its taxes as and when due

4.0 NIGERIAN CONTENT

The interested Company must comply with the following:

- a) Develop a Nigerian Content Plan that demonstrates full utilization of Nigerian labour and services with a detailed description of the role, work scope and manhours in order to achieve the minimum target as set out in the requuirment of the NOGICD Act 2010 (85% Spend; other supporting Services) for this Project. Where in-county capacity is inadequate, propose innovations to bridge the gan
- b) Provide a plan of how it intends to give first consideration to materials, manufactured as well as assembled goods of Nigerian origin which shall include a breakdown of all materials and consumables to be utilized and indentifying those that are found locally, finished products and materials that will be procured from Nigerian manufacturing and assembly plants, finished goods that order can be placed from outside Nigeria though Nigerian affiliates.
- c) Provide a contract-specific organogram showing Names and Nationalities of all key personnel, that will execute the work scope for this service. For any position to be occupied by Expatriate personnel, Company shall commit to obtaining expatriate quota approval from NCDMB before project execution.
- d) Provide detailed description of the location of in-country committed facilities not limited to administrative office.
- e) Provide evidence of completed registration on the NCDMB NOGICD JQS portal.

- f) Submit a detailed training plan which shall provide sustainable training and development (including certification as applicable) for Nigerians in line with the Human Capacity Development Initiative Guideline of the Nigerian Content Development and Monitoring Board (NCDMB). The training plan will include contract-specific training and estimated man-hours. The tenderer is required to submit an MOA with Oil and Gas Trainers Association of Nigeria (OGTAN) trainers to support their training plan2, which shall be 15% of the project Manhours or 3% of the total contract sum.
- g) Provide evidence to show that a minimum of 50% of the equipment to be deployed for the work is owned by a Nigerian subsidiary if the international or multinational company is working through the Nigerian subsidiary including the equipment list (Tenderer to provide verifiable evidence (purchase receipt, bill of sale, etc.) of ownership of equipment in executing this contract.
- h) Provide evidence of approved Nigerian Content Equipment Certificate or status of the application submitted to NCDMB for the certificate for the procurement of all equipment, systems and packages to be supplied on the contract (where applicable). Where Tenderer intends to use subcontractor(s)/supplier(s), Tenderer shall provide same information for the nominated supplier(s)/sub-contractor(s).
- i) All bidders for a project/contract/service with a completion period of 12 months or more are required to submit as part of the Nigerian Content requirement, a signed Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between it and one of the research and development (R&D) Clusters established by the Nigerian Content Development and Monitoring Board (NCDMB). The MOA shall be relevant to the project and shall indicate how the bidder intends to use the relevant R&D Clusters during project execution.
- Detailed specific programmes in place to transfer technology and skills to Nigerian businesses

5.0 MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible for this tender exercise, interested contractors are required to be prequalified in the 3.18.24 – Facilities Management Service in NipeX Joint Qualification System (NJQS) database.
